## **Best Practice- 3 Main Components**

- Multi-disciplinary Team
- Assessments
- Creating a Plan





### **Multi-disciplinary Team**

- Multi-disciplinary team consisting of
  - Special Education Teacher
  - Speech/Language Pathologist
  - Occupational or Physical Therapist
  - Educational Psychologist
  - Behavior Specialist (if necessary)
  - Other members could include school counselors, school nurse, general education teacher



#### **Assessment Practices**

- Standardized Assessments by members of team
- Informal Assessments (Reading Inventories, etc.)
- Observations
- Anecdotal evidence





## **Creating the Plan**

Use assessments and family input to create plan





### **Sample**

#### **Present Level of Performance:**

J was given the Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA) on August 25, 2010. He is reading at an instructional level 8 (age equivalent 6).

J can identify 75 out of the first 100 sight words.

Through observation, it is noted that J uses two reading strategies; using the first letter of the word and looking at the picture, to help him identify an unknown word.



### **Creating a Goal with Objectives**

#### Must be measureable


Goal: By December, 2010, J's level on the DRA will increase from a level 8 to a level 14.

O: J's score on the high frequency word test will increase from 75 words to 90 words

O: J will use the reading strategy of using context clues to identify an unknown word as measured by observation and running record



### **DATA** collection is **KEY**
